BAU IN THE TIMES HIGHER EDUCATION



BAU participates in the Times Higher Education (THE) Impact Rankings since 2019. According to the current rankings, BAU belongs to the 801-1000 band in the World University Rankings, the 401-600 band in the Impact Rankings and the 151-200 band in the Young University Rankings 2023. Also, BAU is ranked among the top 5 universities in Türkiye.

The university continuously increases its standing in categories related to the UN Sustainable Development Goals. As of 2023, BAU holds the following standings in the THE Impact Rankings;

The University takes the above-mentioned rankings as evaluation criteria for progress regarding its adherence and contribution to the UN Sustainable Development Goals and will continue to report its advancement in the rankings on a yearly basis.

Bringing together different national and international stakeholder groups and ensuring that opinions are shared in order to solve the hunger problem in the world is an important priority for Bau.

"Sustainable Agriculture in Africa: Connecting Farmers to Markets" Webinar (4 May 2021)

The Global Policy Institute and Bay Atlantic University held another webinar within their Sustainability Series titled: Sustainable Agriculture in Africa: Connecting Farmers to Markets. The online event was held in partnership with BAU CIFAL Istanbul, and the United Nations Institute for Training and Research (UNITAR). It emphasized SDG 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth), SDG 12 (Responsible Production and Consumption).



"Sustainable Agriculture in Africa: Access to Finance and Investment" Webinar (27 April 2021)

The webinar was held by The Global Policy Institute and Bay Atlantic University, in collaboration with BAU, CIFAL Istanbul and The United Nations Institute for Training and Research (UNITAR). Agriculture has long been referred to as Africa's greatest strength, with the potential to achieve food and nutritional security for the entire continent. However, despite contributing an average of 25% of the continent's GDP in a rapidly growing market, it still remains under-serviced in many ways. While risk capital inflow in Africa has been on the rise, the agriculture sector has not kept pace. It emphasized SDG 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth), SDG 12 (Responsible Production and Consumption).



BAU Smart Agriculture and Sustainable Food Systems Application and Research Center "Women and Cooperative" Trainings (13-14 September 2021)

The Food and Agriculture Organization of UN (FAO) and BAU held a 2-day workshop on the role of women in agriculture and cooperatives under the theme of "Local Products, Gastronomy, Women and Cooperatives". The workshop aimed women cooperatives and their capacity building needs. Within this context, trainings were given by field experts on the following subjects: The storage of agricultural products, agricultural entrepreneurship, good practices in agriculture and how to get them across, community building and decision making, business idea development inspired by the local cuisine, creative communication techniques, and delivery of local agricultural products to the world market.



World Food Day Youth Gathering & Food Systems Impacthon (16 October 2021)

#WorldFoodDay2021was celebrated for the second time against the backdrop of the COVID-19 pandemic, which has led to the deterioration of agri-food systems, an unprecedented global economic downturn, hence a significant reduction in livelihoods and incomes, while increasing food insecurity and inequalities. BAU student clubs came together to develop new ideas and projects on environment and food systems. Food Systems Impacthon emphasized the need to support the transformation to more efficient, inclusive, resilient and sustainable agri-food systems for better production, better nutrition, a better environment and a better life, without leaving anyone behind. The event was organized by BAU, Cifal Istanbul, UNITAR and Food and Agriculture Organization of UN.

Stating that they want to open the products grown in the region to the international arena, Yücel said, "We are establishing an area in Piraziz together with Bahçeşehir University and the United Nations Agricultural Organization. This area is a center for implementing smart agriculture that can shape the agriculture of the future. We want to reveal the endemic plants of the Black Sea, to taste the local dishes related to them, and to open the gastronomy of this region to the international arena. I think we will have achieved our goal if we can provide studies and training to our people on this subject. I hope that these studies will play important roles, especially in the employment of women. We will provide training here. We will have application areas and we will give examples to the participants on how their hand-made products can reach international markets. "Our aim is to show how the valuable plants growing in these lands can be used in agriculture and medicine in the application area of our university," he said.
