

Currently, BAU Global Network comprises of 6 universities (Istanbul, Washington D.C., Berlin, Cyprus, Batumi, Plymouth), 5 liaison offices (BAU Global Azerbaijan Jordan, Uzbekistan, Mongolia, Pakistan) and 5 language schools.

As one of the leading universities in Türkiye, BAU aims primarily to improve the living standards of the local and global society by integrating the sustainable development goals into its corporate processes and culture, educational programs, academic research practices and stakeholder collaborations. BAU with its staff members, students and alumni is a big academic community who are raised as good global citizens committed to each x and the world around them and always act with the utmost sense of ethics and social responsibility.

BAU IN THE TIMES HIGHER EDUCATION

BAU participates in the Times Higher Education (THE) Impact Rankings since 2019. According to the current rankings, BAU belongs to the 801-1000 band in the World University Rankings, 59th in the Impact Rankings and the 173th in the Young University Rankings 2024. Also, BAU is ranked among the top 5 universities in Türkiye.

The university continuously increases its standing in categories related to the UN Sustainable Development Goals. As of 2025, BAU holds the following standings in the THE Impact Rankings;

- 7 th in Quality Education
- 50 th in Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions
- 2nd in Gender Equality
- Ranks between 101-200 in Reducing Inequalities
- Ranks between 201-300 in Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure
- Ranks between 401-600 in Sustainable Cities and Communities

The University takes the above-mentioned rankings as evaluation criteria for progress regarding its adherence and contribution to the UN Sustainable Development Goals and will continue to report its advancement in the rankings on a yearly basis.

Relationships with Government and NGOs for SDG Policy Development

Bahçeşehir University (BAU) actively collaborates with government institutions, intergovernmental bodies, and non-governmental organizations (NGOs) to support the formulation, implementation, and monitoring of Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) policies at local, national, and international levels.


Through these partnerships, BAU contributes research-based expertise, policy analysis, and capacity-building initiatives that help shape evidence-driven strategies addressing social, economic, and environmental challenges.

The University's engagement includes joint projects, advisory roles, and data-sharing collaborations designed to align policy development with the SDGs.

By maintaining continuous dialogue with governmental and non-governmental stakeholders, BAU ensures that its academic and research outputs directly inform policy frameworks, strategic planning, and institutional decision-making.

Examples of BAU's partnerships and policy-oriented initiatives with governments and NGOs and projects are presented in the following section.

Collaborating for Change: Policy, Innovation, and Capacity Building in the Bahcesehir University-FAO Partnership





Since May 2022, Bahçeşehir University (BAU) and the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) have been collaborating to advance sustainable food systems, smart agriculture, and policy development in alignment with the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Formalized through a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU), the partnership focuses on creating a Learning, Research, and Application Platform that fosters innovation, knowledge sharing, and capacity development in the areas of digital transformation, artificial intelligence (AI), and sustainable agriculture.

The cooperation extends to key strategic areas identified in the MoU, including:

- Technical collaboration on digital transformation and the application of Al in food systems;
- Joint initiatives on gender equality and the empowerment of rural women; and
- Advocacy and communication activities aimed at raising awareness and strengthening the ownership of good policies and practices related to the SDGs and global food security agendas.

Since 2022, BAU and FAO have jointly organized policy-oriented workshops, seminars, and public events addressing water management, sustainable agriculture, and food security. These initiatives provide a platform for dialogue among academia, policymakers, and industry stakeholders, supporting evidence-based decision-making and the development of effective national and regional strategies.

Through this ongoing collaboration, Bahçeşehir University contributes to shaping inclusive, technology-driven, and gender-sensitive agricultural policies, reinforcing its role as an academic partner committed to sustainability, innovation, and public policy advancement.

Bahçeşehir University and UNESCO: Advancing Inclusive Sustainability through Project Aladdin: Towards Environmental, Social, and Economic Sustainability: Challenges and Solutions





Since 2013, Bahçeşehir University (BAU) has been a proud partner of Project Aladdin, under the auspices of UNESCO, co-organizing the International University for Intercultural Leadership (IUIL) — a global platform bringing together academics, policymakers and students from more than 60 universities across Europe, the Middle East, Africa, Asia, and the Americas.

In 2024, the IUIL was hosted by Bahçeşehir University in Istanbul, focusing on "Towards Environmental, Social, and Economic Sustainability: Challenges and Solutions." The program explored sustainable development through a multidisciplinary and intercultural approach, addressing climate resilience, women's empowerment, and social justice as central themes. Participants engaged in lectures, workshops, and field research on sustainability policies, inclusive growth, and environmental governance, guided by experts from the UN, UNDP, World Bank, and academia

Through this initiative, BAU strengthened its role as a regional hub for sustainability dialogue, contributing to the design of innovative solutions and policy frameworks that support the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) — particularly SDG 5 (Gender Equality), SDG 10 (Reduced Inequalities), and SDG 13 (Climate Action). The collaboration also enhances intercultural leadership skills and fosters international cooperation toward a more equitable and resilient future



National Policy Forum on Artificial Intelligence and Technology in Hazelnut Farming








The National Policy Forum on Artificial Intelligence and Technology in Hazelnut Farming, held in Giresun in December 2024, was organized under the coordination of the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry and the Giresun Governorship, with the support of Bahçeşehir University (BAU), Giresun University, the Eastern Black Sea Development Agency (DOKA), and several other public, academic, and private sector stakeholders.

The forum brought together government representatives, universities, research institutions, industry leaders, and farmer organizations to develop a national policy roadmap for integrating artificial intelligence (AI) and digital technologies into Türkiye's agricultural production systems, particularly in the hazelnut sector, which plays a strategic role in the country's economy.

Bahçeşehir University contributed to the forum through its expertise in Al applications, sustainable food systems, and policy research, supporting the formulation of data-driven agricultural strategies, evidence-based policy recommendations, and innovation-oriented frameworks.

By connecting national and local institutions, the initiative promotes the digital transformation of agriculture and strengthens Türkiye's commitment to the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)—especially SDG 2 (Zero Hunger), SDG 1 (No Poverty), SDG 9 (Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure), and SDG 13 (Climate Action)—advancing inclusive, climate-smart, and technology-driven agricultural development.

Bahçeşehir University's Engagement in the Impact Investing Advisory Board (EYDK): Strengthening Policy and Strategy Development in Sustainable Finance



The Impact Investing Advisory Board (EYDK) was founded in April 2019 to function as a national high-level platform and NGO for identifying priorities, shaping strategies, and formulating policy recommendations that advance the development of impact investment in Türkiye. Following its formal establishment, EYDK rapidly began operations, engaging public institutions, academia, the private sector, and civil society in a coordinated effort to strengthen the national impact investment ecosystem.


Through these multi-stakeholder collaborations, EYDK has produced inclusive, data-driven policy reports, and achieved substantial progress in areas such as policy development, market expansion, ecosystem communication, and strategic research, all aligned with Türkiye's sustainable development priorities.

In March 2022, EYDK joined the Global Steering Group for Impact Investment (GSG), becoming part of the global impact investment policy network. This membership strengthened Türkiye's position in international sustainable finance discussions and enabled the transfer of global policy insights to national strategy frameworks.

Bahçeşehir University (BAU) became an active institutional stakeholder within EYDK, contributing to policy formulation, strategy design, and advocacy processes related to impact investing. Through academic expertise, research, and capacity-building initiatives, BAU supports the integration of impact-driven investment principles into national policies and promotes sustainable development through evidence-based policymaking.

By participating in EYDK, Bahçeşehir University reinforces its commitment to bridging academia, government, and industry, fostering a policy environment that encourages inclusive growth, responsible investment, and long-term social impact.

Advancing Policy Pathways for Sustainable Food and Land Systems: Bahçeşehir University and NGOs within the FABLE Consortium



Bahçeşehir University serves as the Turkish partner of the global FABLE Consortium (Food, Agriculture, Biodiversity, Land-Use, and Energy), a network of research institutions and NGOs dedicated to developing nationally coherent and globally aligned pathways for achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the Paris Climate Agreement targets.

Within this framework, country teams work to design bottom-up policy pathways for sustainable food and land-use systems and engage directly with national governments to promote data-driven and ambitious sustainability policies. The FABLE Secretariat is jointly led by the Sustainable Development Solutions Network (SDSN), the International Institute for Applied Systems Analysis (IIASA), and the Alliance of Bioversity International and CIAT:

In Türkiye, the initiative is led by the BAU Research Center for Sustainable Food Systems (BAU SUGAM), which consolidates all of the University's partnerships and research efforts related to food, agriculture, and sustainability policy. Through research, data modeling, and policy analysis, BAU contributes to defining science-based policy recommendations, supporting national strategies on food security, climate action, and sustainable rural development:

By linking academia, civil society, and government, Bahçeşehir University strengthens the national capacity for evidence-based decision-making and contributes directly to global policy dialogues on sustainable development.

BAU- United Nations Institute for Training and Research (UNITAR). Collaboration through CIFAL Istanbul for SDG Policy Development and International Cooperation

Bahçeşehir University (BAU) serves as the institutional host of CIFAL Istanbul, the International Training Centre for Authorities and Leaders, established in partnership with the United Nations Institute for Training and Research (UNITAR)

CIFAL Istanbul is part of the UNITAR Global CIFAL Network, a worldwide framework dedicated to capacity development, policy dialogue, and SDG-oriented training for government officials, policymakers, and local leaders.

Under the renewed Cooperation Agreement (2023–2025), BAU and UNITAR jointly design, implement, and evaluate programs that directly contribute to national and regional SDG policy development.

These activities include identifying systemic challenges, developing strategies for sustainable governance, modelling future policy scenarios, and monitoring the implementation of SDG-related interventions at local and regional levels.

Through CIFAL Istanbul, BAU engages in international collaboration and research that strengthens Türkiye's and the broader Eastern European and MENA regions' capacity to integrate the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) into policy and institutional frameworks.

Training and research programs focus on economic development, social inclusion, climate action, and digital transformation, with the goal of fostering data-driven policymaking and adaptive management practices across different levels of governance.

CIFAL Istanbul's annual programs — comprising workshops, seminars, e-learning, and blended courses — reach local and national authorities, civil society representatives, international organizations, and private sector actors, creating a neutral platform for SDG-focused dialogue and knowledge exchange.

The Centre's work contributes to advancing SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals) by strengthening international cooperation for sustainable development; SDG 16 (Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions) by improving governance capacities; and cross-cuttingly supports SDGs 4, 8, 11, and 13 through education, innovation, and climate-oriented policy learning.

Through this sustained partnership with the United Nations, Bahçeşehir University not only contributes to policy development and monitoring mechanisms for the SDGs, but also promotes international best practices, comparative research, and collaborative governance — positioning CIFAL Istanbul as a regional hub of excellence for sustainable development capacity-building and evidence-based policy support.

WHEREAS the United Nations Institute for Training and Research ("UNITAR") is an autonomous body within the United Nations that was established in 1965 pursuant to a United Nations General Assembly resolution and is governed by a Board of Trustees, with the mission to develop the individual, institutional and organizational capacities of countries and other United Nations stakeholders through high quality learning solutions and related knowledge products and services to enhance decision-making and to support country-level action for overcoming global challenges;

BAU Rotary Peace Center – A Neutral Platform for Peacebuilding and Policy Development in the MENA Region



Since 2023, Bahçeşehir University (BAU) has been the only university in Türkiye to host the Otto & Fran Walter Rotary Peace Center, serving the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) region in partnership with CIFAL Istanbul, which operates under the United Nations Institute for Training and Research (UNITAR).

This collaboration positions BAU as a regional hub for peace education, dialogue, policy innovation, and policy development, combining academic excellence with practical field engagement.

The BAU Rotary Peace Center was established with the mission of enhancing human capacity for conflict resolution, peacebuilding, and sustainable development. It provides a safe, neutral, and academically guided environment where individuals from diverse cultural, political, and professional backgrounds come together to exchange ideas, share experiences, and collaborate on solutions to regional and global challenges.

As a platform grounded in impartiality and inclusion, the Center embodies BAU's commitment to fostering open and evidence-based dialogue, ensuring that participants can engage in frank discussions free from political or institutional bias.

Each year, the Peace Center welcomes fellows and professionals from governments, NGOs, academia, and international organizations across the MENA region. The program combines academic coursework, seminars, workshops, and field-based projects, enabling participants to translate theoretical knowledge into practical action. The curriculum emphasizes themes such as peacebuilding, conflict transformation, humanitarian diplomacy, migration, climate resilience, and community development, reflecting the interconnected nature of today's global challenges.

The BAU Rotary Peace Center operates as part of Rotary International's global network of peace centers, linking BAU to a worldwide community of practitioners, researchers, and institutions dedicated to advancing peace and human security.

Its academic program, conducted in English, is hosted at BAU's Future Campus in Istanbul, providing a multicultural environment that mirrors the diversity of the region it serves.

By hosting this Center, BAU strengthens its role as a trusted convener and facilitator of dialogue among actors with differing perspectives.

The initiative directly supports the University's vision of serving as a neutral platform for inclusive discussion and policy development, where academic expertise informs policy practice and mutual understanding.

Through this work, BAU contributes meaningfully to Sustainable Development Goal 16 (Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions) and Goal 17 (Partnerships for the Goals) — promoting good governance, cooperation, and lasting peace through education and collaboration.

Bahçeşehir University as a Member of the Agroecology Coalition for Transforming Global Food Systems



The interconnected crises in food, climate, and biodiversity have created an urgent need for transformative, cross-sectoral action. Recognizing this global imperative, Bahçeşehir University (BAU) joined the Agroecology Coalition, a United Nations-supported global initiative established in the wake of the 2021 United Nations Food Systems Summit (UNFSS) to advance the transformation of food systems through agroecology.

The Coalition was created to provide a collaborative mechanism for countries, academic institutions, and organizations to address multiple challenges simultaneously—ensuring sustainable food production, ecosystem restoration, and climate resilience. Its work is guided by the 13 Principles of Agroecology defined by the High-Level Panel of Experts for Food Security and Nutrition (HLPE-FSN) under the Committee on World Food Security (CFS), aligned with the 10 Elements of Agroecology adopted by the FAO Council in 2019.

Today, the Agroecology Coalition serves as a key global voice for science-based policy dialogue and the implementation of sustainable food systems, bringing together more than 300 members from governments, academia, NGOs, and international organizations.

Its mission is structured around five workstreams:

- . Facilitating co-creation and exchange of knowledge on agroecology,
- . Fostering increased investments in agroecological transformation,
- . Advocating for and amplifying supportive policies,
- . Supporting market pathways for agroecological products, and
- . Strengthening member engagement through capacity building and technical collaboration.

Bahçeşehir University is an official member of the Coalition and contributes actively to several working groups, including those on Policies, Research, Innovation and Education, and Implementation.

Within these platforms, BAU provides expert insight, contributes to the formulation of international policy frameworks, and engages in research-driven collaboration aimed at scaling up agroecological practices and integrating sustainability principles into national and regional strategies.

Through this participation, BAU supports the development and dissemination of international best practices for sustainable food systems, bridging academic research with policy action.

Its role within the Agroecology Coalition strengthens the University's contribution to SDG 2 (Zero Hunger) — advancing food security through sustainable agriculture, SDG 13 (Climate Action) — promoting ecosystem-based approaches to climate resilience; and SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals) — fostering international cooperation for systemic transformation. By working alongside global partners, Bahçeşehir University continues to shape the global discourse on agroecological policy development, supporting the creation of evidence-based, inclusive, and resilient food systems for future generations.

BAU Activities and Initiatives Supporting SDG 17: Partnership For The Goals

"Hear Me" Mosaic Concert in Collaboration with Mozaik Women's Music Ensemble, CIFAL Istanbul, UNITAR, and Bahçeşehir University (25.12.2024)





Held on 25 December 2024, the "Hear Me" Mosaic Concert was jointly organized by Mozaik Women's Music Ensemble, CIFAL Istanbul, UNITAR, and Bahçeşehir University to amplify solidarity and collective action in support of earthquake-affected women and children. The event provided a meaningful platform to raise awareness of the physical, psychological, and economic challenges faced by women, particularly in post-crisis and disaster-affected regions. Through the power of music and artistic collaboration, the initiative exemplified how partnerships across cultural, academic, and international institutions can advance shared goals of gender equality, social inclusion, and humanitarian support. All proceeds from the concert were donated to the Hatay Hayat Cooperative, a local organization assisting women and children who lost their homes and livelihoods after the February 6 earthquakes. The funds contributed directly to food aid, essential supplies, and recovery efforts in Hatay—one of the most severely affected regions.

By fostering cooperation between academia, local communities, and civil society, Bahçeşehir University and its partners demonstrated a strong commitment to **collective recovery and sustainable development**, reflecting the spirit of global partnership embedded in the 2030 Agenda. The concert not only mobilized empathy through art but also showed how **collaborative efforts** can transform compassion into tangible support for vulnerable groups, reinforcing resilience, inclusivity, and unity in times of crisis.

International Panel on Forced Displacement and Health in Collaboration with Johns Hopkins University's Center for Humanitarian Health, BAUMUS, and Bahçeşehir University Faculty of Medicine (30.01.2024)





Held on 30 January 2024, the international panel "Forced Displacement and Health: Learning from Country Experiences to Create a Better Future" was jointly organized by Bahçeşehir University Faculty of Medicine, BAUMUS, and Johns Hopkins University's Center for Humanitarian Health. This collaborative initiative gathered global experts and academics to explore the intersections of migration, health systems, and humanitarian response, sharing country-level experiences and evidence-based solutions.

By emphasizing the importance of cross-border partnerships and knowledge exchange, the event reflected the essence of collective action toward inclusive and resilient health systems. Discussions focused on addressing the health challenges of displaced populations, improving access to essential services, and strengthening coordination among international and local actors in humanitarian settings. Through this partnership, Bahçeşehir University reaffirmed its commitment to building global networks for sustainable health equity, promoting joint learning, and contributing to shared progress toward the 2030 Agenda.

BAU Bi'Soluk Student Club and Gastronomy Club's Monthly Solidarity Activities in Collaboration with "Çorbada Tuzun Olsun" Association



Throughout the 2024–2025 academic year, Bahçeşehir University's Bi'Soluk Student Club, together with the BAU Gastronomy Club and the "Çorbada Tuzun Olsun" Association, has continued to organize regular monthly volunteer-based activities aimed at supporting individuals facing poverty and homelessness. These joint efforts exemplify how sustained partnerships between universities, student organizations, and civil society can create meaningful social impact through shared responsibility and community engagement.

By promoting empathy, compassion, and active citizenship, the initiative empowers students to take collective action against social exclusion and economic hardship. This ongoing collaboration reflects Bahçeşehir University's dedication to building bridges across sectors and fostering solidarity-driven partnerships that address social inequalities. Through cooperation and mutual support, the project strengthens community ties and embodies the university's vision of advancing the 2030 Agenda through inclusive, participatory, and partnership-based action.

Equal Opportunity in Technology Certification Program in Partnership with CIFAL Istanbul (UNITAR) and Yapı Kredi Bank





Bahçeşehir University (BAU), in collaboration with CIFAL Istanbul, affiliated with the United Nations Institute for Training and Research (UNITAR), and in partnership with Yapı Kredi Bank, continues to strengthen its commitment to inclusive innovation through the "Equal Opportunity in Technology Certification Program." This long-term partnership exemplifies how academia, international organizations, and the private sector can work collectively to advance women's participation in technology, supporting a more equitable and diverse digital transformation.

The program provides free, high-quality training delivered by Bahçeşehir University's expert faculty, offering comprehensive modules in Big Data, Artificial Intelligence, Cloud Technologies, Cybersecurity, the Internet of Things (IoT), and Industry 5.0. By aligning academic excellence with real-world applicability, this collaborative effort promotes capacity building and lifelong learning in line with global standards.

In 2024, the initiative expanded its inclusivity by opening participation to all women aged 15 and above—without an upper age limit—and extending access to individuals of any gender residing in the Hope Cities established by Koç Holding following the Kahramanmaraş-centered earthquakes. Participants who meet the program's academic requirements receive E-Government approved certificates jointly accredited by UNITAR and Bahçeşehir University, reflecting the strong institutional collaboration at the heart of this initiative.

Since its launch in 2023, the program has empowered 22,450 women by the end of 2024, creating tangible progress toward gender equality and digital inclusion. By uniting the expertise of academia, the outreach of the private sector, and the global vision of the United Nations, this partnership demonstrates how collective action and cross-sector collaboration can accelerate progress toward a sustainable and inclusive future in alignment with the 2030 Agenda.

Participants who successfully complete the program earn a Professional Competency Certificate, validating their skills and readiness for the software industry. Netflix x BAU: Collaborative Pathways for Innovation in Communication and Media (16.10.2024)













Led by a team of Bahçeşehir University faculty members and industry experts, the program combines theoretical training and hands-on workshops held at Zorlu PSM. Upon successful completion of the program and evaluation process, participants receive certification qualifying them to work as Entry-Level Stage Technicians in live performance settings.




The 7th International Conference on Analysis and Applied Mathematics (ICAAM 2024) was successfully held in Antalya, jointly organized by Bahçeşehir University (BAU) and The Scientific and Technological Research Council of Türkiye (TÜBİTAK). Bringing together 214 participants from 21 countries, the conference served as a significant platform for international collaboration and scientific exchange in the fields of analysis, modeling, and applied mathematics.

The event opened with remarks from Prof. Dr. Arif Engin, Dean of the BAU Faculty of Engineering and Natural Sciences; Prof. Dr. Allaberen Ashyralyev, Chair of the Organizing Committee; Prof. Dr. Michael Ruzhansky, Director of the Department of Mathematics at Ghent University; and Prof. Dr. Makhmud Sadybekov, Director of the Institute of Mathematics and Mathematical Modeling in Kazakhstan. Renowned scholars, including Prof. Dr. Alexey Karapetyants, Prof. Dr. Alexander Skubachevskii, Prof. Dr. Sergey Kabanikhin, Prof. Dr. Alexander Goncharov, Prof. Dr. Vitaly Volpert, Prof. Dr. Andrey Muravnik, Prof. Dr. Zalina Kusraeva, and TÜBA member Prof. Dr. Ekrem Savaş, shared their latest research findings and perspectives on emerging mathematical methods and applications.

Supported by the strong academic foundation of BAU's weekly "Analysis and Applied Mathematics" seminars, ICAAM 2024 once again underscored Bahçeşehir University's leadership in promoting global scientific cooperation and research excellence. Through its partnership with TÜBİTAK and the international academic community, the conference demonstrated the university's dedication to advancing mathematics as a shared global discipline and fostering collective innovation in science and education

Student Academy Certificate Program Launched in Collaboration between Bahçeşehir University and Oyak Renault (2024)

The program concludes with a Factory Day at Oyak Renault, where students present their final projects to industry experts.

Upon completion, participants receive a joint certificate issued by Bahçeşehir University and Oyak Renault, recognizing their professional growth and applied learning achievements. This initiative exemplifies effective academia-industry collaboration, enhancing youth employability, fostering innovation, and supporting Sustainable Development Goal 4 (Quality Education) and SDG 9 (Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure) through collective action and partnership-based learning.

Young Ideas on the Brand Journey Program Organized in Collaboration between Bahçeşehir University and Abdi İbrahim Pharmaceuticals (October-November 2024)



On 5 December 2024, in recognition of Women's Rights Day, the webinar "Women's Human Rights and Participatory Democracy" was co-organized by FEJUST, the Gender Equality Monitoring Association (CEİD), the Bahçeşehir University Political Science and International Relations Club, CIFAL Istanbul, UNITAR, and Bahçeşehir University. The event explored the interconnection between women's rights and democratic participation, emphasizing the role of inclusion, representation, and civic engagement in advancing social justice and gender equality.

By combining innovation, inclusion, and international cooperation, the Future Women Project exemplifies the transformative power of cross-border partnerships in education and gender empowerment. The 104th Commemoration of the First Turkish Women's Rally Against the Occupation of Anatolia with the Participation of Bahçeşehir University (10.12.2023)



On 10 December 2023, the 104th Commemoration of the First Turkish Women's Rally Against the Occupation of Anatolia (1919) was held at the Üsküdar Bağlarbaşı Congress and Culture Center, bringing together scholars, students, and members of the public to honor the pioneering women who took a historic stand for independence and equality during Türkiye's national struggle. Prof. Nilüfer Narlı, Founding Director of TOSAM (Center for Health, Society, Behavior, and Prevention Studies), represented Bahçeşehir University at the ceremony, delivering remarks that emphasized the enduring legacy of women's civic engagement and leadership in shaping the nation's democratic foundations.

The commemoration revisited one of the earliest examples of organized women's activism in Turkish history, connecting its historical significance to contemporary efforts for gender equality, social justice, and inclusive governance. By celebrating the courage and agency of these trailblazing women, the event underscored the importance of collective memory and civic participation in advancing sustainable development. 

STM and Bahçeşehir University Collaboration: Co-Light Underwater Lighting System (2024)



n 2024, Bahçeşehir University, in collaboration with Defense Technologies Engineering and Trading Inc. (STM), developed the Co-Light Underwater Lighting System—an innovative technology designed to improve underwater visibility and support sustainable marine research and maintenance practices. Emerging from a long-term university-industry partnership, this initiative exemplifies how collaborative innovation can bridge engineering excellence with environmental responsibility to advance marine science and sustainability.

The Co-Light system enables high-clarity imaging and detailed underwater observation without the need for extensive dry-docking or invasive interventions, allowing divers and researchers to conduct real-time analyses efficiently. By optimizing light distribution and minimizing resource consumption, the system enhances the sustainable management of marine operations and has practical applications in underwater photography, ecological monitoring, and coastal infrastructure assessment.

Through this partnership, Bahçeşehir University and STM demonstrate the transformative potential of cross-sector cooperation in developing eco-conscious technologies that promote environmental stewardship, innovation, and sustainable resource use. The project stands as a model of how academic-industry collaboration contributes to SDG 9 (Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure), SDG 14 (Life Below Water), and SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals) by turning shared knowledge into collective action for resilient and sustainable marine ecosystems.

BAU International Forum on Political Economy – "The Future of the International System and Global Energy" in Cooperation with the Center for Economic, Strategic and Social Research (TESAM) and Bahçeşehir University (22.05.2024)



On 22 May 2024, Bahçeşehir University (BAU), in cooperation with the Center for Economic, Strategic and Social Research (TESAM), hosted the BAU International Forum on Political Economy at the Faculty of Law's Doctorate Hall under the theme "The Future of the International System and Global Energy." The event convened academics, diplomats, policymakers, and experts from a range of ideological and institutional backgrounds to discuss the evolving dynamics of the global political and economic system through open, evidence-based dialogue.

Structured around two core sessions, the forum first examined "The Future of the International System," exploring the long-term China-US balance, the rise of regional alliances, and the strategic significance of the Global South for Türkiye. The second session, "The Future of Energy," focused on energy security, the political economy of energy, sustainability challenges, and legal implications in an increasingly multipolar world.

By creating a neutral and inclusive platform for constructive debate and collaborative problem-solving, the forum reflected Bahçeşehir University's commitment to fostering global academic partnerships and policy dialogue that strengthen peace and institutional resilience. COP29 Session: "The Role of Higher Education in Addressing Climate Change – Leadership, Innovation, and Impact" in Collaboration with UNITAR, CIFAL Istanbul, Bahçeşehir University, and CIFAL City of London (11.11.2024)





On 11 November 2024, during the United Nations Climate Change Conference (COP29) held in Baku, Azerbaijan, a high-level session titled "The Role of Higher Education in Addressing Climate Change: Leadership, Innovation, and Impact" was co-organized by the United Nations Institute for Training and Research (UNITAR), CIFAL Istanbul, Bahçeşehir University, and CIFAL City of London. The event convened academic leaders, policymakers, and sustainability experts to explore how higher education institutions can strengthen their contributions to global climate action through research, innovation, education, and partnership.



Panel: "Invisible Chains – Multidimensional Strategies to End Modern Slavery" in Collaboration with the Equality Association (Toplumsal Eşitlik Derneği), CIFAL Istanbul (UNITAR), and Bahçeşehir University TOSAM (Center for Social, Health, Behavioral, and Preventive Studies) (02.12.2024)



On 2 December 2024, marking the International Day for the Abolition of Slavery, Bahçeşehir University's Center for Social, Health, Behavioral, and Preventive Studies (TOSAM) organized the panel "Invisible Chains: Multidimensional Strategies to End Modern Slavery" in collaboration with the Equality Association (Toplumsal Eşitlik Derneği) and CIFAL Istanbul (UNITAR). The event brought together experts from law, academia, and social work to examine the persistence of modern slavery and human trafficking through legal, social, and global perspectives.

While Business Corners focus on interactive seminars and thematic panels with multiple speakers, Business Points are one-on-one career sessions offering personalized feedback and guidance from HR professionals. Together, they provide complementary learning environments—one collective and exploratory, the other individual and strategic—ensuring students receive both broad sectoral awareness and tailored career development support.

Business Corners

Business Corners are designed as open-format seminars where representatives from the corporate world share their experiences on topics such as sustainability, innovation, leadership, and digital transformation.

In 2023–2024, 32 Business Corner sessions were held with companies including Publicis Global Delivery, Penti, Orion Innovation, Dinçer Lojistik, Oyak Renault, UNICEF, Takasbank, TAB Gıda, Hilton, and Doğuş Group. These events encouraged interactive dialogue between students and industry experts, providing a platform to discuss changing business ecosystems, sustainable management practices, and career expectations in the modern labor market.

By connecting theory with real-world practice, Business Corners help students develop analytical thinking, adaptability, and entrepreneurial mindsets—competencies essential for sustained productivity and responsible professional engagement.

Business Points

Business Points constitute the individualized dimension of the CO-OP model. Each session features 20-minute one-on-one interviews between students and HR managers from partner firms.

Throughout 2023–2024, 34 Business Point meetings were conducted with companies such as Siemens, Shell, QNB Finansbank, CarrefourSA, Watsons, Danfoss, Polisan Holding, Akenerji, KPMG, Rebul, and Benetton. These interactions allowed students to receive personalized feedback on their CVs, interview performance, and career goals while directly exploring internship or employment opportunities.

By enabling early professional contact and customized mentoring, Business Points enhance students' employability and confidence, preparing them for inclusive and sustainable participation in the labor market.







CO-OP Academy

The CO-OP Academy is an exclusive, merit-based training program targeting high-achieving juniors and seniors (GPA 3.0 and above). Conducted over ten sessions, it integrates workshops on personal branding, LinkedIn optimization, artificial intelligence in business, and leadership development.

In 2023–2024, 20 students were selected for the program, engaging directly with experts from Flormar, Microsoft, IGA, Philips, and Realpeople.

By cultivating leadership, digital literacy, and innovation-driven thinking, the CO-OP Academy nurtures a new generation of professionals capable of steering organizations toward long-term sustainability and competitiveness.

Abstract





The two-day training program was designed to build the capacity of local government professionals and policymakers from across the Istanbul metropolitan region, equipping them with the skills and knowledge required for participatory and sustainable strategic planning.

Held on the first day at the Marmara Municipalities Union headquarters and on the second day at Bahçeşehir University's Beşiktaş Campus, the program focused on strengthening municipal teams during Türkiye's post-election strategic planning period.

Participants explored how to develop inclusive, data-driven, and SDG-aligned local strategies that respond to urban challenges such as climate adaptation, social policy, and equitable resource allocation.

The training covered the structure of municipal systems, roles of local actors, and the functions and methodologies of strategic planning.

Modules included sessions on participatory governance, local advocacy, and integration of Sustainable Development Goals into local policy frameworks.

The program concluded with a hands-on strategic planning exercise, where municipal representatives collaborated to design sample strategic plans reflecting both global indicators and local priorities.

Now in its seventh iteration, the Local Advocacy School has become a model for capacity-building and outreach education among local governments in Türkiye.

By fostering cooperation between universities, municipalities, and civil society organizations, the initiative serves as a neutral and inclusive platform that empowers local policymakers to design sustainable urban policies.

Through this program, Bahçeşehir University contributes directly to Sustainable Development Goal 11 (Sustainable Cities and Communities), Goal 16 (Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions), and Goal 17 (Partnerships for the Goals) by strengthening local governance, promoting transparency, and advancing collaborative, evidence-based policymaking.

Seminar on Business, Law, and Human Rights: "German Supply Chain Act and Its Impact on Businesses, Supply Chains, and Human Rights Actors" – Collaboration Between Bahçeşehir University, Minerva, PAE Law, and the European Neighbourhood Council (26.02.2024)



Bahçeşehir University hosted an international seminar titled "German Supply Chain Act and Its Impact on Businesses, Supply Chains, and Human Rights Actors" on 26 February 2024, organized in collaboration with Minerva, PAE Law, and the European Neighbourhood Council. The event convened academics, practitioners, policymakers, and industry professionals to explore the far-reaching implications of Germany's new supply chain law, which reinforces corporate accountability, human rights protection, and ethical production standards across global operations.

Speakers from partner institutions examined the law's influence on corporate due diligence, labor rights, and governance, while encouraging companies to integrate human rights and sustainability principles into every stage of production and trade. Discussions also emphasized the social, legal, and economic dimensions of the legislation, promoting dialogue on the transformation of global business ethics and compliance practices.

Through this multisector collaboration, Bahçeşehir University created a powerful platform for knowledge exchange and collective action, fostering partnerships between academia, policy, and industry that advance decent work (SDG 8), responsible production (SDG 12), justice and governance (SDG 16), and global partnerships (SDG 17). The initiative reaffirmed the university's commitment to strengthening ethical business education and sustainability-oriented policymaking aligned with international standards of justice and corporate responsibility.

CIFAL Istanbul Team Participation in Reforestation Efforts in Istanbul – A Collaborative Environmental Initiative (09.11.2024)





On 9 November 2024, CIFAL Istanbul team members Eren Yalınkaya and Aslıcan Açık took part in a reforestation initiative organized to restore forested areas in Istanbul that were severely damaged by the 2023 wildfires. Conducted by Dr. Nilüfer Geysi and Prof. Ahu Ergen, the program explored global warming, environmental justice, communication strategies for climate action, and sustainability-centered business transformation.

Participants examined how environmental consciousness can be integrated into corporate strategy and governance, fostering responsible decision-making and organizational change. By linking academia, international institutions, and the private sector, the initiative stood as a model of multi-stakeholder cooperation, promoting climate literacy and practical sustainability education.

Through this strong collaboration, the program advanced SDG 4 (Quality Education), SDG 12 (Responsible Consumption and Production), and SDG 13 (Climate Action)—while exemplifying SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals) by translating joint expertise into tangible, climate-oriented impact.

Empowering Future Generations: Darüşşafaka High School Students Career Development Programme – Collaboration Between Bahçeşehir University, CIFAL Istanbul–UNITAR, CO-OP, and Darüşşafaka Society (02.09–25.11.2024)



Originally launched in 2023, the program continued in 2024. The High School Students Career Development Programme has been led by Bahçeşehir University as a part of its CO-OP Responsibility initiative. The programme embodies Bahçeşehir University's commitment to ensuring equal opportunities in education and expanding access to quality learning experiences beyond the university campus.

Through interactive sessions such as "Artificial Intelligence and Digital Transformation," "Sustainability and the Future of Work," "Technology and Creativity," and "Cybersecurity and Digital Ethics," participants explored how innovation, ethics, and environmental responsibility shape modern professions. The program encouraged students to use technology as a means to create positive social and environmental impact, rather than merely as a career instrument.

By integrating personal development with global awareness, the initiative fostered the values of sustainability, inclusion, and lifelong learning, exemplifying the power of multi-stakeholder collaboration in education. Through this partnership between academia, international organizations, and a leading educational foundation, the program advanced SDG 4 (Quality Education), SDG 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth), SDG 9 (Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure), and SDG 13 (Climate Action)—while embodying SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals) through its collective commitment to empowering future generations.

Global Leadership Forum: Evolution of the International System, Global Peace and Security – Collaboration Between Bahçeşehir University, Global Akademi, and UNITAR CIFAL Istanbul (27.05.2024)



On 27 May 2024, Bahçeşehir University's International Leadership Practice and Research Center (ULMER) and the Government and Leadership School (HLO), in collaboration with Global Akademi, organized the Global Leadership Forum under the theme "The Evolution of the International System and Global Peace and Security." The event took place in Giresun's Kulakkaya Plateau with the support of the Council on International Relations (UİK), Panorama Portal, and UNITAR CIFAL Istanbul, reflecting the power of multi-stakeholder cooperation in addressing pressing global issues.

The forum convened policymakers, diplomats, academics, and institutional leaders to discuss the transformations reshaping global peace and governance. It provided a neutral and interdisciplinary platform for open dialogue on challenges such as multipolarity, institutional fragility, climate-related insecurity, and the future of rule-based international order. Discussions were guided by a policy report authored by Prof. Evren Balta and Assoc. Prof. Soli Özel, exploring "Power Shifts and Insights for Understanding the New International Order."

By engaging experts from different sectors in policy-oriented workshops and training sessions, the forum strengthened the analytical and strategic capacities of public officials and young leaders. Through this ongoing collaboration between academia, government, and international institutions, Bahçeşehir University reinforces its commitment to inclusive governance, sustainable peace, and evidence-based policymaking. The Global Leadership Forum directly advances SDG 16 (Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions) and SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals) by fostering global cooperation, dialogue, and joint action toward a more stable and equitable international system.

TÜBİTAK-MCST Bilateral Project: SOLEATECH – Al-Based Sustainable Agriculture for Olive Cultivation



Co-led by Assoc. Prof. Dr. Zeynep Tacer Caba from the Faculty of Engineering and Natural Sciences, Bahçeşehir University (Türkiye), and Dr. Barbara Bracone from WES Trade Ltd. (Malta) in collaboration with the University of Malta, this bilateral R&D project (2023–2026) focuses on developing an Al-based preventive and decision-support model for sustainable olive cultivation in Mediterranean regions. Funded jointly under the TÜBİTAK-Malta Council for Science and Technology (MCST) cooperation program, the project exemplifies cross-border innovation in sustainable agriculture and green technologies.

The SOLEATECH Project aims to create a predictive Artificial Intelligence model capable of providing early warnings and guidance to farmers and agronomists for improving olive yield, optimizing irrigation, and managing soil conditions. By combining data from autonomous ground sensors with ontological, climatic, and historical datasets, the project seeks to uncover correlations that can inform timely interventions, reduce water waste, and enhance agricultural productivity.

The research integrates two complementary technological components:

- . IRRIGOPTIMAL, developed by WES Trade, focuses on data-driven irrigation optimization, and
- . BAU's Artificial Neural Network Predictive Model, which utilizes machine learning algorithms to analyze environmental and soil behavior patterns affecting olive tree health.

The project's methodology relies on operational pilot sites in both Malta and Türkiye, representing diverse Mediterranean agro-climatic conditions. The fusion of expertise from both countries—Malta's experience in water management and BAU's applied AI research—enables the design of a robust, scalable, and sustainable model that directly supports farmers in achieving eco-efficient and climate-smart agricultural practices.

The international collaboration between BAU, WES Trade, and the University of Malta also ensures long-term knowledge transfer and research continuity, supported by prior collaborations such as the ELAIWA Project. Data and models developed within SOLEATECH are intended to inform agricultural policy, enhance resilience in the olive oil value chain, and contribute to sustainable rural development across the Mediterranean region.

This project directly supports SDG 9 (Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure) by integrating artificial intelligence into agricultural innovation ecosystems, fostering cross-border research infrastructure, and strengthening industry-university partnerships. It also contributes to SDG 2 (Zero Hunger) and SDG 12 (Responsible Consumption and Production) by promoting sustainable food production, and SDG 17 (Partnerships for the Goals) through international scientific collaboration.

Through its 2023–2026 framework, SOLEATECH demonstrates how Al-driven preventive systems can transform traditional farming into data-informed, resilient, and sustainable agricultural practices, contributing both to technological innovation and environmental stewardship under the goals of SDG 9. https://plumtri.org/Project-SOLEATECH
